
# Q1 What best describes you?



I would strongly suggest either designing a more sturdy beach trash enclosure that can withstand high tide and storm events and put the trash bins back on the beach, or simply return to placing trash bins and small enclosures at the beach side of every community boardwalk. Both "removing all trash bins" or "moving trash bins to the land side of the boardwalk" have significant downsides. Having picked up trash on the beach for a significant amount of time, I feel it would be a nightmare to ask visitors and some owners to take their trash with them. A significant portion of beachgoers do not remove their trash now and asking them to remove ALL of their trash may be disastrous. Moving trash bins to the land side of the boardwalk would have several problems associated with it. The first of which is beachgoers will not walk that far to throw away incidental trash, and secondly, the trash bins may provide an eyesore for homeowners.
